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the history of cinema is full of love stories but none has been as essential as the love between projectionists and their machines the art of film projection a beginner s guide is a comprehensive outline of the materials equipment and knowledge needed to present the magic of cinema to an enthralled audience part manual and part manifesto this book compiles more than fifty years of expertise from the staff of the world renowned george eastman museum and the students of the l jeffrey selznick school of film preservation into the most authoritative and accessible guide to film projection ever produced no film comes to life until it is shown on the big screen but with the proliferation of digital movie theaters the expertise of film projection has become rare written for both the casual enthusiast and the professional projectionist in training this book demystifies the process of film projection and offers an in depth understanding of the aesthetic technical and historical features of motion pictures join in the fight to save the authentic experience of seeing motion pictures on film

to many the technological aspects of projection often go unnoticed only brought to attention during moments of crisis or malfunction for example when a movie theater projector falters the audience suddenly looks toward the back of the theater to see a sign of mechanical failure the history of cinema similarly shows that the attention to projection has been most focused when the whole medium is hanging in suspension during hollywood s economic consolidation in the 30s projection defined the ways that sync sound technologies could be deployed within the medium most recently the digitization of cinema repeated this process as technology was reworked to facilitate mobility these examples show how projection continually speaks to the rearrangement of media technology projection therefore needs to be examined as a pivotal element in the future of visual media s technological transition in practices of projection histories and technologies volume editors gabriel menotti and virginia crisp address the cultural and technological

significance of projection throughout the volume chapters reiterate that projection cannot and must not be reduced to its cinematic functions alone borrowing media theorist siegfried zielinski s definition menotti and crisp refer to projection as the heterogeneous array of artefacts technical systems and particularly visual praxes of experimentation and of culture from this readers can understand the performative character of the moving image and the labor of the different actors involved in the utterance of the film text projection is not the same everywhere nor equal all the time its systems are in permanent interaction with environmental circumstances neighboring structures local cultures and social economies thus the idea of projection as a universal fully autonomous operation cannot hold each occurrence of projection adds nuance to a wider understanding of film screening technologies

cavell s ontology of film presents ten essays by some of the most prominent international scholars of stanley cavell s work with a double purpose to look back half a century after its original publication at cavell s now seminal film philosophical book *the world viewed* 1971 enlarged 1979 and to draw on its concepts to assess the world in the current age of digital media and climate change the volume opens with a series of essays that revisit cavell s discussion of film crucially including classical hollywood movies in the context of modernism several authors consider whether this preoccupation with modernism in cavell s early work ultimately and anachronistically gave way to an embrace of romanticism or whether cavell conceives these frameworks as offering different responses to the persistent problem of skepticism others consider how popular filmmakers or film genres outside hollywood might contribute to or alter cavell s thoughts on the movies moreover taking to heart that some of cavell s main lines of thought are premised on the idea of film as an analog medium that projects and screens the world inside a theater several contributions to this volume nevertheless project *the world viewed* s concepts onto the future of our televisual and digital culture the volume finally loops back to cavell s discussion of modernism in *the world viewed* so as to find the seeds of a cavellian politics for the age of climate disaster thus beyond celebrating the past through a collection of reviews and reflections on *the world viewed* a book of ontological reflection that themselves conceive the world on screen as a world past the present volume is best understood as a series of cavellian meditations on media and mediated relations to the world sustained in the wake of cavell s own passing 2018 by an ongoing current of thought on the idea of temporality itself

at a time when what it means to watch movies keeps changing this book offers a case study that rethinks the institutional ideological and cultural role of film exhibition demonstrating that film exhibition can produce meaning in itself apart from the films being shown *cinema off screen* advances the idea that cinema takes place off screen as much as on screen by exploring film exhibition in china from the founding of the people s republic in 1949 to the end of the cold war in the early 1990s drawing on original archival research interviews and audience recollections *cinema off screen* decenters the filmic text and offers a study of institutional operations and lived experiences chenshu zhou details how the screening space media technology and the human body mediate encounters with cinema in ways that have not been fully recognized opening new conceptual avenues for rethinking the ever changing institution of cinema

rich in detail this is a study of the interrelationships between film historical discourse and archival practices exploring the history of several important collections from the eye film museum in amsterdam bregt lameris shows how archival films and collections always carry the historical traces of selection policies restoration philosophies and exhibition strategies the result is a compelling argument that film archives can never be viewed simply as innocent or neutral sources of film history
